Since the dawn of recorded history, alcohol has enriched our culinary

Currently, the Alcohol Epidemiology Program at the University of Minnesota's School of Public Health harbors some of the nation's foremost experts on alcohol control policies. Nearly every year, the Minnesota state legislature considers some of the most controversial alcohol regulations and policies.

"The Power of the Privilege Log"

A party claiming attorney-client privilege and/or work product for documents requested through discovery must itemize the documents on a privilege log. A well-drafted privilege log should describe the nature of the documents, communications or things withheld in a manner that allows the other parties to assess the applicability of the privilege. However, parties often provide insufficient information to assess the applicability of the privileges claimed, leading to a privilege log dispute. The article examines the important role privilege logs can play in litigation, outlining the applicable law and best practices for evaluating and responding to privilege logs in order to avoid costly discovery disputes.

Sick and Safe Time/Minimum Wage Increase Updates

Sick and Safe Time Update

In 2017, the cities of Minneapolis and St. Paul enacted new ordinances concerning mandatory sick and safe leave time for employees working within the boundaries of each respective city. The ordinances went into effect on July 1, 2017 for Minneapolis employers, and January 1, 2018, for St. Paul employers with 22 or fewer employees.

Minimum Wage Increase Update

On July 1, 2018, the minimum wage in the City of Minneapolis is set to increase to \$10.25 for small employers (100 or fewer employees) and to \$11.25 for large employers (more than 10 employees). This minimum wage increase is to continue, annually, until it reaches \$15.00 per hour for large businesses in 2022, and for small businesses in 2024.

regulatory teeth into how EU member states handle the protection of personal data. In fact, the GDPR makes the protection of the processing of personal data a fundamental right.

The GDPR applies to all businesses that control the processing of personal data and/or process personal data of EU citizens. The GDPR affects US businesses by extending protection to EU citizens no matter where their data travels. This means that any company, anywhere, that has a database that includes EU citizens is bound by the GDPR.
